Cru Summer Missions Tweeted that for the 2015 summer there were 183 teams plus 3,512 students that went on summer missions.

Part-way through the summer, the staff head out from Medora and we are then given roles to fulfill. My team was filled with people I have never met before, but they quickly became like family. 
CRU HEADQUARTERS
